Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

The quilt and block diagrams portrayed are virtual images. The layout and look of your project may differ when using actual fabric.

$41 / 8$ Yards C120-RILEYRED (including binding)
5 Yards Backing

## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Please read instructions before cutting fabrics. Refer to the quilt photo for the placement of each of the fabrics. Use a straight edge ruler and rotary cutter to cut your fabrics.

Cutting and sewing instructions are organized by star: Vertical Half Star (VHS), Horizontal Half Star (HHS), or Quarter Star (QS). Individual fabrics are labeled light (L) or dark (D) and numbered.

Label pieces as they are cut.

Cut (1) strip $2 ½ \times 21^{\prime \prime}($ QS-D6)

Cut (1) strip $51 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF (See Cutting diagram for reference.)
Subcut (1) $51 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle (D)
From the remaining $51 \frac{1}{2 \prime} \times 29^{\prime \prime}($ WOF) section, cut:
Cut (1) strip $17 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF
Subcut (1) 17 7/8" $\times 17$ 7/8" square Cut in half diagonally once (G) Cut (1) $131 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip

Subcut (1) $131 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 131 / 2$ " square
Cut in half diagonally once (E)
Subcut (1) $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ square (I)
Cut (1) $127 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip
Subcut (2) $127 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 127 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares
Cut each in half diagonally once (A)

Cut (1) $291 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip
Subcut (1) $29 \frac{1 ⁄ 2 " ~}{2} \times 22 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle (C)
Subcut (1) $291 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 97 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle (H)

Cut (1) $181 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip
Subcut (2) $181 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 171 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles (F)

Cut (1) $17{ }^{1 / 22^{\prime \prime}} \times$ WOF strip
Subcut (2) $171 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 171 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares (B)

Cut (8) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for binding

## ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

Refer to the cutting requirements list, quilt photo and layout diagram for the placement of prints. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise stated.

## Strip Set \& Star Construction Overview

Stars are created using $21_{2}^{\prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ strips. Strips are sewn together lengthwise and offset 2 " on the left-hand side. Each 6 -fabric strip set is constructed from the top down. The strip set is then cut across the seams at a $45^{\circ}$ angle to produce $21 / 2$ "-wide multi-fabric strips. 6 different multi-fabric stripsone each from 6 different strip sets—are assembled into a star's diamond shape; 2 diamonds equal a quarter star and 4 diamonds make a half star.

## Vertical Half Star

1. Gather the 5 light and 6 dark strips with labels beginning with VHS. Organizing the strips into lights and darks and then in numerical order is recommended.

Strip Set 1 (VHS-SS1)
VHS-L5 + VHS-D5 + VHS-D1 + VHS-L1 + VHS-L4 + VHS-D3
2. Mark the far left side of the first strip with a pin, or use another method of your choice. This will always indicate the left side of the strip.

3. Right sides together, offset the second strip 2" back from the left edge of the first strip and sew the bottom edges together.

4. Repeat Step 3, offsetting each subsequent strip 2" from the left. Continue in this manner working from top to bottom.

5. Align the $45^{\circ}$ line of your quilting ruler with either the top edge of the strip set or one of the seams. Make your initial cut.

6. Starting from the straightened edge cut 4 multi-fabric $21 / 2$ "-wide strips and label these VHS-SS1. You may want to repin or re-mark the first fabric (VHS-L5) for convenience's sake.


7. Repeat Steps 2-6 to make 5 additional strip sets with the fabrics indicated below. Cut 4 multi-fabric strips from each strip set. Label accordingly.

8. Beginning with VHS-SS1, sew the multi-fabric strips lengthwise together in order from bottom to top. Keep the pinned or marked edge of each strip to the left and match seams from strip to strip.


The resulting diamond is one-eighth of a star with a star point at one end and a star center at the other end. Make 4.

9. Sew 2 star diamonds together matching star centers in the top right corner. With a pencil, mark a dot in the top left corner at the intersection of the 2 adjacent $1 / 4$ " seam allowances. Backstitch to the dot then sew the top edge seam to make a quarter star. Press seam open. Make 2.

10. Repeat Step 9 using 2 quarter stars to make a half star. Press seam open.


Horizontal Half Star
11. Repeat Steps 1-10 of Vertical Half Star instructions using 7 light strips and 4 dark strips with labels beginning with HHS.
Sew together 6 strip sets using the following fabric combinations.

12. Repeat Steps 1-9 of the Vertical Half Star instructions (pages 3-5) using 5 light strips and 6 dark strips with labels beginning with QS. Sew 6 strip sets together using the following fabric combinations.
Exceptions:
Step 6-Cut 2 multi-fabric strips from each strip set. Step 8-Make only 2 star diamonds.

## Quilt Center

Refer to the Quilt Center Diagram (page 9) for the orientation of the stars and the placement of background squares, rectangles and triangles. Notice the orientation of the C and F rectangles in particular. Trim any excess from sections, leaving $1 / 4$ " seam allowances beyond each point. Seam intersections circled in red indicate backgrounds that extend beyond the star point. Do not trim these edges to a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance beyond the star points.

The double arrow symbol indicates which end of a seam is most important to align. Y-seams (or set-in seams) are used to attach several squares, triangles and rectangles, as well as the final seam that finishes the quilt top. See sidebar, Sewing Y-seams.
13. Sew 2 triangles $A$ and a square $B$ to the Quarter Star (QS). A $Y$-seam is required to attach square $B$.

Trim the QS-section to $291 / 2 " \times 291 / 2 "$, retaining a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance beyond each star point.
14. Add rectangle $C$ and rectangle $D$. The QS-section measures $42^{\prime \prime} \times 51$ ½". Set aside.
15. Sew triangles A and $\mathbf{G}$ and square $\mathbf{B}$ to the Vertical Half Star (VHS) using Y-seams where needed. Attach rectangle F (note the orientation) and triangle E allowing them to extend beyond the star's point. Attach rectangle H . The VHS-section measures $29 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 68 \frac{1}{2}$ ". The top edge should be straight but not trimmed to the star point. If the length needs shortening, cut excess from rectangle H . Set aside.
16. Sew triangles A and G , square I , and rectangle F to the Horizontal Half Star (HHS). (Note the orientation of rectangle F) Add triangle E last. The HHS-section measures $71^{\prime \prime} \times 291 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.
17. Sew the QS-section to the top of the HHS-section - note the double arrow symbol.
18. Add the VHS-section by aligning the top edges (see double arrow symbol) and completing the last Y -seam. Trim the quilt top to $71^{\prime \prime} \times 801 / 22^{\prime \prime}$.
19. Finish quilt by layering the quilt top, batting, and back. Bind with the Riley Red strips. Have fun and enjoy the journey of making your quilt.

## Sewing $Y$-seams

Believe it or not, you've already prepared some of your Y-seams! (See Vertical Half Star, Step 9, page 5.) The next step involves sewing 2 sides of a shape as 1 seam. Here's what to do next:


Right sides together, match the fabric edges on the left leg of the $Y$-seam and sew until the dot. Leave needle down into the "stem" of the $Y$-seam (see dot).


Lift the presser foot and align the right leg of the Y-seam edges. Lower presser foot and sew.


Open and voila!
