

Laundry Days

FINISHED QUILT SIZE 58" x 66"

Finished Block Size 8" x 8"

Measurements include ¼" seam allowance. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Please check our website www.rileyblakedesigns.com for any revisions before starting this project. This pattern requires a basic knowledge of quilting technique and terminology. The quilt and block diagrams portrayed are virtual images. The layout and look of your project may differ when using actual fabric.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

1 yard (95 cm) orange main (C3780 Orange) 2¼ yards (2.1 m) green cloth (C3781 Green) 1 Vintage Happy 10-inch Stacker (10-3780-24) Binding ¾ yard (60 cm) Backing 3 ¾ yards (3.4 m)

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS

Please read instructions first before cutting. Seam allowances vary so measure through the center of the quilt before cutting border pieces.

Laundry Days Block

Choose 21 assorted prints from the 10-inch stacker. From each of the 21 assorted print 10" squares, cut 1 square $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " and 4 squares $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $2 \frac{1}{2}$ ".

Cut 84 rectangles 21/2" x 41/2" from green cloth

Setting Block

Cut 21 squares 81/2" x 81/2" from green cloth

Border 1

Cut 6 strips 51/2" x WOF from orange main

OUILT ASSEMBLY

Refer to quilt photo for placement of fabrics and blocks.

Laundry Days Block

These instructions are to make 1 block. Sew a green cloth 2½" x 4½" rectangle to the sides of an assorted print 4 1/2" square to create Unit A. Sew an assorted print 2½" square to the sides of a green cloth 2½" x 4½" rectangle to create Unit B. Repeat to create 2 Unit B's. Sew the Unit A and Unit B's together to complete the Laundry Days Block. Repeat to create 21 Laundry Days Blocks.

Laundry Day Block

Quilt Center Assembly

Refer to quilt photo for placement of Laundry Days Blocks and Setting Blocks. Lay out blocks in 7 rows of 6 blocks. Sew rows together to complete the center of the quilt.

Borders

Seam allowances vary so measure through the center of the quilt before cutting border pieces. Sew border strips together end to end if necessary to get the length needed. Sew side borders first.

Border 1

Side borders should be $56\frac{1}{2}$ ". Top and bottom borders should be $58\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Finish quilt by layering the quilt top, batting, and back. Bind with your favorite Riley Blake fabric from the Vintage Happy Collection. Have fun with your colors and enjoy the journey of making your quilt.
