#### Materials

Fabrics listed are Confetti Cottons by Riley Blake

Bleached Denim 4½" x 4½" Cornflower 4½" x 4½"

Cadet 6½" x 23" Oxford 4½" x 8"

Cloud 1/8 Yard

#### **Tools**

Marking pencil, scissors, ruler, rotary cutter and mat, iron and ironing board.

## **Cutting Instructions**

Cloud: A- two 3½" squares

B- four 3" x 5½" rectangles


Cornflower: C- one 3½" square
Bleached Denim: D- one 3½" square
Oxford: E- two 3½" squares
Cadet: F- two 3½" squares

G- eight 3" squares




### **Sewing Instructions**

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the A squares. Align the A and C squares, right sides together. Sew along both sides of the drawn line with a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Cut along the drawn line. Makes two half square triangle blocks (HST). Open and press both HSTs. Trim to 3" x 3". Repeat with the remaining A square and D square, and with both of the E squares and F squares.



2. Arrange and sew the A/C and A/D HSTs together as shown below to create the center Pinwheel  $(5\%'' \times 5\%'')$ .





3. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the G squares. Place a G piece on the top left corner of a B rectangle and sew on the drawn line. Trim away excess fabric, leaving  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press. Repeat the process with another G square in the top right corner to complete the Flying Geese unit (3" x 5½"). Repeat to make a total of 4 Flying Geese units.



4. Lay out pieces and sew as illustrated below. Sew sections into rows. Press to complete the Wind Blown block  $(10\%'' \times 10\%'')$ .
