FINISHED QUILT SIZE 41" x 47"

Finished Block Size 5" x 5"

Measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Please check our website www.rileyblakedesigns.com for any revisions before starting this project. This pattern requires a basic knowledge of quilting technique and terminology. The quilt and block diagrams portrayed are virtual images. The layout and look of your project may differ when using actual fabric.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

1 Toy Chest 3 5-inch Stacker (5-6760-42)

$\frac{1}{8}$ yard (15 cm) green dot (C6763 Green)

$\frac{3}{4}$ yard (70 cm) red kitties (C6764 Red)

$\frac{1}{4}$ yard (25 cm) green ditzy (C6766 Green)

1 $\frac{1}{4}$ yards (1.15 m) Riley white solid (C120 Riley White)

$\frac{1}{2}$ yard (50 cm) binding

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS

Please read instructions first before cutting. Seam allowances vary so measure through the center of the quilt before cutting sashing and border pieces.

5-inch Stacker

Choose 30 squares from the stacker. Cut 9 squares $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " from each for a total of 270 squares.

Green Dot

Cut 2 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF. Cut the strips into 42 squares $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " for posts.

Green Ditzy

Cut 4 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for Border 1.

Red Kitties

Cut 4 strips $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for Border 2.

Riley White Solid

Cut 5 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF. Cut the strips into 120 squares $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Cut 11 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF. Cut the strips into 120 rectangles $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Riley White Solid (Continued)

Cut 11 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF. Cut the strips into 71 rectangles $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " for sashing.

QUILT ASSEMBLY

Refer to the quilt photo for placement of fabrics as each block is different.

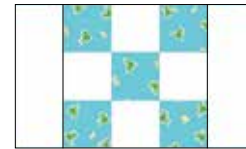
Chain Block

These instructions are to make 1 block. Sew 5 print $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 4 Riley white solid $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares together to create a Nine-Patch Unit.



Nine-Patch Unit

Sew a Riley white solid $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to each side of the Nine-Patch Unit to create the Center Unit.



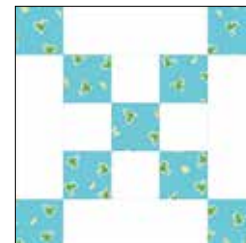
Center Unit

Sew a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " print square to each side of a Riley white solid $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to create Unit A. Repeat to make 2 Unit As.



Unit A

Sew a Unit A to the top and bottom of the Center Unit to create the Chain Block. Repeat to make 30 assorted Chain Blocks.



Chain Block

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Posts and Sashing

Refer to the Quilt Center Diagram for post and sashing placement. Sew a green dot 1½" square to a Riley white solid 1½" x 5½" rectangle. Repeat to make a row with 6 posts and 5 sashing rectangles. Make 7 post and sashing rows.

Sashing and Block

Refer to the Quilt Center Diagram for sashing and Chain Block placement. Sew a Riley white solid 1½" x 5½" rectangle to a Chain Block. Repeat to make a row with 6 sashing rectangles and 5 blocks. Make 6 block and sashing rows.

Quilt Center Assembly

Refer to the Quilt Center Diagram for row placement. Sew rows together to complete the center of the quilt.

Borders

Seam allowances vary so measure through the center of the quilt before cutting border pieces. Sew border strips together end to end if necessary to get the length needed. Sew side borders first.

Border 1

Side borders should be 37½". Top and bottom borders should be 33½".

Border 2

Side borders should be 39½". Top and bottom borders should be 41½".

Finish quilt by layering the quilt top, batting, and back. Bind with your favorite Penny Rose fabric from the Toy Chest 3 Collection. Have fun with your colors and enjoy the journey of making your quilt.
